

## 3<sup>RD</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Simon and Andrew, James and John were working when Jesus called them. They immediately put down their nets and followed Jesus. Can you imagine? The disciples walked away from their previous way of life and toward another, in which Jesus and his way take precedence. They put aside anything that would stand between themselves and the life of discipleship. Jonah acted similarly--he perceived the Lord's call and responded without question. He literally walked a different path, toward Nineveh. No doubt, Saint Paul's own dramatic conversion was in his mind as he wrote to the community in Corinth. The path of discipleship is about holy perspective. Do not let anything stand between you and Christ.

### LEAVE BEHIND


Simon, Andrew, James, and John abandoned their nets and followed Jesus. The nets were their livelihood, the most important tools for their work as fishermen. For these first disciples, their nets represented all they knew life to be about, and all it could be. Yet they put the nets aside, risking an unknown future in order to "catch people" as Jesus promised. What do you need to leave behind? Most people will not be asked to give up their livelihood in order to answer Christ's call. Yet we certainly must abandon everything that prevents us from living our lives authentically as followers of Jesus. Sometimes we must let go of the life we know in order to embrace a living, compelling, meaningful life of faith in Christ. Prayerfully examine your faith and life. Is there attachment to material possessions? Are there relationships or feelings that prevent you from living and growing in faith? Is there a negative habit that gets in the way? Let go of what stands between you and the Lord. Invite God's healing presence, forgiveness, and mercy to transform the nets--all that holds you back--and risk answering Christ's call to discipleship.

### WALK TOWARD

Jonah did not simply walk away from his previous way of life. He walked toward Nineveh. The disciples did not only abandon their nets. They walked toward Jesus and to a life of discipleship. G. K. Chesterson is quoted as saying, "Christianity has not been tried and found wanting; it has been tried and found difficult." Yet Christian living is also deeply meaningful. What would happen if you truly took the call to follow Jesus to heart? It isn't only about turning away from things that are counter to the Christian way of life. As it was for Jonah, the disciples at the seashore, and Saint Paul, a true life of faith is also about walking toward God, about loving God and neighbor, about risking an unknown future filled with life and goodness, holiness and grace.

## R U Listening?

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." With these words, Jesus invites Simon (Peter) and his brother, Andrew, to follow Him and be His disciples.

We often speak of the subtleties of translation. In the original Greek in which St. Mark wrote his Gospel, a better translation would be, "Come after me, and I will make you become fishers of men." It is the beginning of a process.

We are called to that same process. It is not as if it happens quite suddenly. It happens over time, and it is a progression. If we are to be "fishers of men," we are to be evangelizers and disciples of the Lord, and we are to represent what it means to be part of the Kingdom of God.

Of course, Simon and Andrew "abandoned their nets and followed him." It may be more difficult for us to "abandon our nets" so to speak, but it does prompt us that we need to make major changes in our lives if we are going to follow Jesus.

# Pastor's Pulpit

## How're Your New Year's Resolutions? God's Image In Us

I am still working on my New Year resolution and I asked for your help.

As I mentioned in my Jan 7 Pastor's Pulpit, my resolution this year is to be more reverent in Church and with the people I meet. Reverence for the presence of Christ in the Sanctuary and in the Tabernacle. In addition, I need to strengthen my reverence for others in the way I greet and interact with them.

Several years ago, I taught World Religions in high school. I must confess that I think I got more out of the course than the students. I can remember the greeting that many people in India and Nepal use with each other. Their term is **Namaste**. This is an ancient Sanskrit greeting still in everyday use in India and especially when you are walking on the trails in Nepal's Himalayan mountains.

Translated roughly, it means **I bow to the God within you**, or The Spirit within me salutes the Spirit in you which is a knowing that we are all made from the same



One Divine Consciousness. Imagine if this were truly believed and practiced.

As Christian and Catholic, we believe that the presence of God resides in all people. The **Imago Dei**, the image of God, is present in us all. Imagine how reverent and respectful we could be to each other if we believed that and practiced it.

In a few weeks we will be entering the Lenten Season and will be reminded that we are all called to be more reverent and respectful. I will try my best to call to mind my resolution of being more reverent in Church and with all those who I meet throughout the day.

So, if I place my palms together and bow to you, I am acknowledging the presence of God within you and within me. Isn't this something very similar to the many ways in which we greet each other at Mass? "Peace be with you" and "The Lord be with you" and "And with your Spirit" are the manners in which we acknowledge the presence of God within each other.

There is a lot more to those greetings than simply shaking hands. The handshake is believed by some to have originated as a gesture of peace by demonstrating that the hand holds no weapon. Interesting indeed...may we grow in reverence and respect.



## PARISH SURVEY RESULTS

During Lent last year, St. Norbert Parish participated in a national Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey sponsored by the Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI). This survey looks at parishioners' attitudes and beliefs regarding the local Catholic community, spiritual growth, personal beliefs and faith. Participants are asked about their participation in activities such as Confession, Mass, service, hospitality, bible study/workshops, and retreats. Other questions ask about parishioner satisfaction with the parish, pastor and parish activities. Demographic questions help form a profile of parish communities and survey respondents.

**Thank you, everyone who responded!** More than 600 St. Norbert parishioners completed the survey, an excellent 48% response. Parishes normally see a 12-20% response the first time they participate. Overall, nearly 82,000 parishioners from 366 parishes in 21 Dioceses

have responded in the last four years to the DMI Survey. St. Norbert's participation was made possible by a generous grant from a CLI benefactor.

The St. Norbert Five Year Parish Pastoral Plan (2014-2019) has three goals:

- 1) **Encountering Jesus:** To create a community that encourages an Encounter with Jesus
- 2) **Focusing on Sunday:** To enhance the Sunday experience of our worship to better enable parishioners to encounter Jesus
- 3) **Forming Fervent Disciples:** To engage and enable our parish to grow as a community of Fervent Disciples through our ministries and discipling efforts

This survey helps gauge the vibrancy of our parish and measure how effective we are in forming disciples. The results are compared with all parishes in the study and with the top 3 high-scoring parishes in the country. There is a lot of data and we have been analyzing the results. Below are some key findings and the date and time for a Town Meeting to review the results with all parishioners.

### KEY STRENGTHS

**Parishioners Are Likely to Recommend St. Norbert's:**

**Question:** *I would recommend my parish to a friend*  
**Our Result:** Close to 70% of respondents are likely to recommend St. Norbert Parish to others.

The top-mentioned reasons are: 1) The pastor; 2) A vibrant and engaging Sunday Mass; 3) Feeling welcomed and accepted; 4) Preaching connects to everyday life; 5) Accessible information and communications; 6) Parish helps them recognize God's work in their life.

**Comment:** St. Norbert's response lies midway between the parish average (55%) and the score of the top 3 U.S. parishes (85%). While there is room for growth, clearly parishioners are passionate about St. Norbert's.

**Parishioners Want to Grow Spiritually:**

**Question:** *Which of the following best describes the pace of your spiritual growth?* 1) Period of decline; 2) Stalled; 3) Content with where I am; 4) Growing Steadily; 5) Would like to grow more; 6) In a period of rapid growth

**Our Result:** More than 70% of our parishioners are growing steadily, want to grow more, or are in a period of rapid spiritual growth.

**Comment:** In line with our pastoral goals, St. Norbert parishioners are encountering Jesus, focusing on our Sunday experience and growing as Fervent Disciples. Efforts like the **RESPOND: Deepening Discipleship** series are helping people go deeper and grow spiritually.

### AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

**Witnessing to the Faith:**

**Question:** *How does the parish equip parishioners to share their personal witness story?*

**Our Result:** Only 17% of respondents believe our parish is equipping them to share their personal witness story (the national average is about 16%). The response is far higher (40%) in the top 3 parishes.

**Comment:** St. Norbert Parish is addressing this through a strong support for faith sharing groups, our monthly Witness Sundays, Bible study, and Becoming Fervent Disciples.

**Helping Parents Teach Their Children**

**Questions** Agree or disagree: (1) One of my most important responsibilities as a parent is helping my child(ren) to know Jesus; (2) I have adequate support from my parish to help my child(ren) grow as disciples of Jesus Christ.

**Our Results:** While an overwhelming 61% of parents feel they are responsible for helping their children to know Jesus, only 29% feel the parish is providing "adequate support."

**Comment:** When this survey was fielded, St. Norbert's was just half-way through our new CaFFE Family Life effort (Catholic Family Formation and Evangelization). Other programs such as the *Walking With Purpose* group for women and the new *That Man Is You* program for men to help strengthen faith and form more Fervent Disciples to meet these and other challenges.
