

26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Blessed Giles of Assisi, in the thirteenth century, wrote, "No one can attain the knowledge of God but by humility. The way to mount high is to descend." This helps express the profound truth of today's readings. In Ezekiel's view, only the humble can acknowledge fault and turn to God with repentance. In the Gospel from Matthew, those who view themselves humbly are able to recognize God's presence in Jesus. And in his letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul's stirring hymn tells the story of Jesus, who through his humility showed us the depths of God's love. Jesus Christ is exalted as Lord precisely because of his humility and service to God. In our own parishes and faith communities, just like the Christian community of Philippi, we are called to follow Jesus' way, and live with humility and in service to one another.



By What Authority?

Today's Gospel describes the second half of a sharp exchange between Jesus and the Jewish religious leaders. They asked, "By what

authority do you do these things?" Much of this dispute is about authority. How could Jesus claim to represent God's purposes? This question continues to resonate today. Who speaks for God? Who doesn't? How do we tell the difference?

Jesus' response is, look at the evidence. Look at how, in response to John the Baptist and to Jesus, people were healed in body and in spirit. Look how people found new intimacy with God, and how they turned away from their sin. The authority of John and of Jesus rested not in some position within the religious institutions, but in the grace and healing power evident in John and in Jesus.

CHANGING YOUR MIND

The readings today make it clear that to be a follower of Jesus you have to be able to change your mind. More precisely, we must allow God to change us, to transform our minds. For most of us, this can be really hard. This is why the readings speak so much about humility. Humility opens up our capacity to be transformed. Humility allows us to challenge our own thinking and behavior, so as to avoid self-justification on one hand, and self-denigration on the other hand. Humility can be cultivated in the practice of reflection. This might mean claiming some time to allow God into our busy days. This might mean time away, through a retreat or day of quiet, perhaps with the help of a spiritual guide or director.

Humility can also be cultivated in actions of service. We learn Jesus' humility through washing each other's feet. We can place other's interests ahead of our own, and relinquish our need to be in control. When we cultivate humility, we create space within us to allow God to take residence and transform us.

Being Loveable

St. Paul offers a formula for living the way we are supposed to live as Christians in the Second Reading. Paul writes, "Do nothing out of self-ishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." Doing that is a challenge for most all of us. Yet, that is one of the secrets to being a good steward and living as Christ wants us to live.

To truly live that way requires a dramatic conversion. All of us know people who are so self-centered that they often are not even aware that they are totally unwilling to compromise or to even recognize the value of those around them. Achieving this kind of self awareness, of what kind of a person we are, is a significant step on our faith and life journeys.

Screenwriter and playwright William Nicholson once wrote, "God does not necessarily want us to be happy. He wants us to be lovable, worthy of love, able to be loved by Him. What makes people hard to

Pastor's Pulpit

A CHALLENGE AND A REMINDER ... SAYING "I DO"

This past Saturday, at Daylesford Abbey, James Garvey was ordained to the priesthood by Bishop Timothy Senior, Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia.

During the Rite of Ordination, the words of instruction and questions by the Bishop to the one to be ordained are very prayerful and meaningful. The response is a simple "I do."

The picture of Bishop Senior and James Garvey are most important. The laying on of hands and the calling down of the Spirit are what the ordination is all about.

Through the laying on of hands by the Bishop and the Prayer of Ordination, the gift of the Holy Spirit for the priestly office is conferred on the candidate. The following words pertain to the nature of the reality effected and are consequently required for the validity of the act:

"Grant, we pray, Almighty Father, to these, your servants, the dignity of the priesthood; renew deep within them the Spirit of holiness; may they henceforth possess this office which comes from you, O God, and is next in rank to the office of Bishop; and by the example of their manner of life, may they instill right conduct."

Together with the Bishop, the priests present at the ordination, lay hands on the candidates to signify

incorporation into the presbyterate.

Dear sons, before you enter the Order you must declare before the people your intent to undertake this office.

Do you resolve, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to discharge without fail the office of priesthood in the presbyteral rank, as worthy fellow workers with the Order of Bishops for the Lord's flock?" "I do."

Do you resolve to exercise the ministry of the word worthily, wisely, preaching the Gospel and teaching the Catholic faith? "I do."

Do you resolve to celebrate faithfully and reverently, in accord with Church's tradition, the mysteries of Christ, especially the sacrifice of the Eucharist and the sacrament of Reconciliation, for the glory of God and the sanctification of the Christian people? "I do."

Do you resolve to be united more closely every day to Christ High Priest, who offered himself for us to the Father as a pure sacrifice, and with him to consecrate yourselves to God for the salvation of all? "I do, with the help of God."

Do you promise respect and obedience to me and my successors? "I do."

Do you promise respect and obedience to your Ordinary? "I do."

Do you promise respect and obedience to the diocesan Bishop and to your legitimate superior? "I do."

May God who has begun the good work in you bring it to fulfillment.

After 47 years on my part as a priest, it is still a reminder, a challenge and a joy in so many ways.

In years to come, I pray that Fr. James Garvey, O Praem, remembers that moment and the words of the Bishop.

Please pray for all priests.






