

## **28<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Our readings this week speak of God's promises and their fulfillment, all in different ways. Isaiah presents a feast set in the future and hosted by God. Here the participants witness the astonishing generosity of God. At the feast, God gives the ultimate gift, the destruction of death itself. Saint Paul, confident in the fulfillment of God's abundant promises, urges the Philippians to live in gratitude and patience. Today's Gospel, however, is more challenging for us to hear. While announcing God's generous invitation, Jesus also describes, in dramatic imagery, how people may reject the invitation. Matthew reminded the early church of the need to recognize God's summons and be prepared to participate fully in God's banquet. This complex and unsettling parable invites our reflection on the nature of God's invitation and our response.

### **A STARK CONTRAST**

The parable in today's Gospel is like a political cartoon or graphic novel. It uses exaggerations and odd plot twists to convey its message. There is little attempt to be "realistic." Jesus compares the rejection of him by the chief priests and elders to an outrageous imaginary scene. To its audience, it would be deeply offensive that anyone summoned to a royal wedding banquet would violently reject the invitation. This would indicate a full revolt against the king. The parable was a blunt accusation against the religious leaders. In comparison, the people found on the streets who go to the banquet are like those who accepted Jesus during his ministry. They are the "unimportant" people who are surprisingly receptive to him. Matthew draws a stark contrast to accuse the priests and elders and to uplift ordinary people who recognize the presence of God in Jesus.

### **RECEIVING GOD'S JOY**


The final scene introduces the unacceptably dressed banquet guest. Matthew is concerned here about the full readiness of those who accept God's invitation. A superficial assent or participation is not enough. God wants our whole selves invested here.

Jesus' followers are to be prepared for the banquet, as suggested by the wedding garment. The meaning of the garment is not clearly explained. It's helpful to recall that a wedding banquet, then and now, is a profoundly joyous event. Being dressed appropriately means being ready to celebrate. Our hearts must be ready to receive God's joy.

Indeed, it can be difficult to be receptive to joy when we have been hurt in many ways during our lives. Our pain may cause us into close up, pulling away from others and away from God. It helps to remember that our God overflows with joy and is eager to share the fullness of joy with us. In our times of suffering, God actively invites us to receive this joy, and in turn to share it with others.



## R U Engaged?

Today's Gospel from the Book of  
Matthew again includes parables.  
We have been hearing the Lord share  
parables with us throughout our  
readings in recent weeks. Interest-  
ingly, Matthew contains 23 parables  
(or teachings classified as parables),  
while Luke has 28. Mark has only 9,  
and John has none.

The first parable we hear today is  
called *The Parable of the Wedding  
Feast*. In this story shared by Jesus  
for our benefit, a king is hosting a  
wedding feast for his son. He sends  
out invitations and people ignore  
them or choose not to respond. It  
may seem somewhat remarkable to  
us that people turn down an invita-  
tion to a royal wedding feast.

Yet, the Lord invites us to join Him  
on a regular basis through Holy  
Scripture and the Sacraments. Many  
ignore the invitation, and in most  
cases are not even aware of the fact  
they have received it. Those who  
read this are aware of the invitation.  
The question is "How do we re-  
spond?"



What do we do after we attend a  
Holy Mass? What is our reaction to  
the reception of Christ's incredible  
gift in the Eucharist? We may not  
make light of it like some of the peo-  
ple in the parable, but if we merely  
go our separate ways, and do not  
strive to be active disciples, we are  
basically doing the same thing as  
those Jesus describes in this parable.  
In one of his first appearances Pope  
Francis declared, "Go make disciples  
of all nations." **We cannot make  
disciples unless we are our-  
selves disciples.** © catholicsteward.com



# Pastor's Pulpit

**R-E-S-P-E-C-T...R-E-S-P-O-N-D...**

## “LIGHT MY FIRE”

R-E-S-P-E-C-T was a hit song for Aretha Franklin in the late 1960's. Last Sunday at the 9 AM Mass I had that song in my head when I went to talk with the children who would be going out into the oratory for Children's Liturgy of the Word.

The young children looked at me like I had two heads, and they had no idea what I was talking about, other than that they knew what the word respect meant. I mistakenly said that the song was by Sister Sledge, a Philadelphia group. I was corrected in a nice way by those in the pews and the choir when they let me know it was Aretha Franklin.

Imagine yourself singing that song, but with the letters and theme of our Fervent Discipleship.....**R-E-S-P-O-N-D**. I can hear it playing in my head. What a wonderful manner of delving into the meaning of Fervent Discipleship for the Parish. To be so excited about the Gospel Message that we cannot wait to R-E-S-P-O-N-D.

That reminds me of another song from the 1960s by the Doors called "Light My Fire." Recently, Bishop Robert Barron has come out with a new book titled *To Light a Fire on Earth: Proclaiming the Gospel in a Secular Age*.

I have been a follower of Bishop Robert Barron and his message of the Gospel for several years. He put together the CATHOLICISM series and it was an excellent summary of our faith for believers and for those interested in knowing more about our Catholic faith.

Bishop Barron was rector of Mundelein Seminary in

Chicago and was appointed auxiliary-bishop of the Los Angeles Archdiocese. How he is able to produce the inspiring weekly and Sunday homilies is amazing. I encourage you to go to his website [WordonFire.org](http://WordonFire.org) to view his video commentaries on the Sunday readings, movie reviews, and topical current events. He must have tremendous organizational skills and a massive number of people working with him. Those old enough to remember often compare him to Bishop Fulton Sheen.

In a video<sup>1</sup> he just released telling how he came to write *To Light a Fire on Earth: Proclaiming the Gospel in a Secular Age*, Bishop Barron explains what he sees as the challenges of the twenty-first century for believers in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. According to a review on Amazon.com, Bishop Barron touches "on everything from Jesus to prayer, science, movies, atheism, the spiritual life, the fate of the Church in modern times, beauty, art, and social media, Barron reveals why the Church matters today and how Catholics can intelligently engage a skeptical world."

In the video, Bishop Barron says that he wants "Word on Fire to become a religious movement drawing people in where we use our internet outreach to draw people in, especially lay people, and ask them to dedicate themselves to a certain style of life centered around evangelization, to become themselves evangelizers."

Listening to Bishop Barron on this video talk about a religious movement made me think of our St. Norbert Parish and our vision "...to become a community of fervent disciples, who listen attentively for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and who lovingly embrace Jesus, present in the poor, the alienated and the spiritually hungry."

That is what we are doing with RESPOND as we look at the scriptures for the next six weeks and discover how a Fervent Disciple goes deeper into a personal relationship with Jesus (see the article below).


