

26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In these times of increasing disparity between the richest among us and the poorest, and the decline of the middle class, much discussion goes on over what constitutes a “living wage.” With employers crying that higher wages will bankrupt them, and politicians warning that paying a living wage will destroy jobs, we see a dilemma over the treatment of the poor and the middle class. Unions, which once assured workers a voice in negotiations with employers, are becoming weaker and are besieged by corporations and politicians. Where is God in all of this?

The Letter of James speaks clearly and forcefully about the fate of the rich in their dealings with the poor and with workers. “Behold, the wages you withheld from the workers . . . are crying aloud . . . and . . . have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts.” Those who are oppressed are equated with the suffering Christ, as the rich are addressed, “You have condemned, you have murdered the righteous one; he offers you no resistance.” Clearly, what we have done to the least ones, we have done to our Lord.

ALL THE PEOPLE OF THE LORD

When Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp, away from the other prophets, Joshua, Moses’ beloved aide, urges Moses to stop them. Moses replies “Would that all the people of the LORD were prophets!” He proclaims that grace abounds for all and that the word of the Lord should be proclaimed by all the people.

We see a similar situation in the Gospel of Mark. John tells Jesus that someone who does not follow him with them is driving out demons in Jesus’ name. Jesus replies “Do not prevent him . . . For whoever is not against us is for us.” In other words, Jesus is saying the same thing as Moses: Would that all the people prophesied in God’s name!

THE DEVASTATION OF SIN


Jesus goes on to teach about sin and its consequences. “Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea.” By “little ones,” Jesus means the humble followers as well as innocent children who love him. Certainly those who have abused children have not caused the children “to sin,” but have made them victims of the worst kind of abuse. These people are worthy of condemnation.

Jesus next points out something so strong in its condemnation of sin that it alarms us when we hear it, knowing that we all are sinners. But Jesus often speaks in metaphors and parables, and it is not necessary to take his teaching about cutting off hands and feet and gouging out eyes literally. It can be taken to mean that if we are guilty of sin, we should make an immediate break from our sinfulness and return to God. Better to cut sin out of our life than to enter into eternal darkness.

There is so much to learn from these readings that we have many things to ponder and to pray about. Take advantage of these wise teachings to become closer to Christ and to treat one another with love and care.

Gratitude**Holding On**

Our Gospel passage and the Second Reading from the letter of St. James urge us to examine our lives for anything that is keeping us from loving God above all else.

Jesus says, "If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off... If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. And if your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out."

St. James warns, "Come now, you rich, weep and wail over your impending miseries. Your wealth has rotted away, your clothes have become moth-eaten, your gold and silver have corroded, and that corrosion will be a testimony against you."

The urgency of our need to detach from all that is not God is clear. When we hold onto possessions too tightly, they come to possess us. The "stuff" can easily become the focus of our energy and attention. Attachment to material things slowly and

The faith that was expressed by so many people who came out with their blankets, chairs and families gave me a sense that there is **HOPE** for our Church though Christian music, song, Confession, Mass and Adoration during a beautiful candlelight procession.

I met so many people who were truly faith-filled with their families and friends. Even Mother Nature, with a little prayer power incentive, provided a very nice refreshing day and evening. "I was absolutely desperate for this weekend. AbbeyFest is an outdoor Catholic faith and music festival that has been attracting thousands of people from the area for the past couple of years with awesome musicians, wonderful speakers, and an undeniable awareness of the Holy Spirit. The festival concludes with candlelit adoration in this

massive field, a moment which has more than once brought me to tears. Last year, the younger two (Peter, age 4 and Norah, age crazy) had prevented us from staying until the end. I was really frustrated. This year, I had my plan of attack. Especially given the last six weeks, I was determined not to miss my moment of inspiration. I organized a drive-by pick up of Peter and Norah by my parents following Mass so that the rest of us could enjoy what I have found to be the most impactful part of the

day. Peter was sad he would not be able to stay for the whole time, but we somewhat convinced him it would be more fun to play with Nanny and Pop-Pop.

"As has been the custom at AbbeyFest, toward the end of



Mass, they invite all the young women and men who might be considering a vocation to the priesthood or religious life to come forward for a blessing (photo above). Worrying about the time, I looked at my phone to see how much longer until I could dispense of my fatherly duties and just enjoy the day. Suddenly, Tricia hit my arm and told me to go get Peter. "Where is he?" I asked only imagining what he might be into. She pointed smiling as little Peter was halfway down the aisle walking next to high school guys three times his size. I hurried down to meet him and he waved me off reminding me, "You're already a dad. This is for guys who might want to be priests." I stood back. As his eyes looked up to heaven and on the priest bestowing his blessing, my eyes were fixed on Peter. What I was about to ship off in order to find my inspiration, was in fact the inspiration I needed all along, in front of me, every day. I could not help but think of the meaning of his name and the promise of our Lord – "upon this rock, I will build my Church." In these moments, where we may be tempted to be "robbed of hope," let us follow those unlikely sources of inspiration, like Peter, who keep moving forward with their eyes fixed on heaven."

FATIMA SECRETS & PRAYER

Against the backdrop of WW I, Our Lady of what became known as Fatima appeared to three small children aged 9 to 6 who were tending the family's sheep. The woman in white with gold trim on her veil and holding a rosary appeared six times between May 13 and Oct 13, 1917. According to the Catholic News Agency, three prophetic "secrets" were revealed to the children with the first two a "...vision of hell and the souls languishing there [with] the request for an ardent devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary [along with] the prediction of the Second World War...and the immense damage that Russia would do to humanity by abandoning the Christian faith and embracing Communist totalitarianism. The third 'secret' was not revealed until the year 2000, and referred to the persecutions that humanity would undergo in the last century: 'The good will be martyred; the Holy Father will have much to suffer; [and] various nations will be annihilated.' The suffering of the popes of the 20th century has been interpreted to include the assassination attempt on Pope John Paul II in 1981, which took place on May 13, the 64th anniversary of the apparitions. The Holy Father attributed his escape from certain death to the intervention of Our Lady: '... it was a mother's hand that guided the bullet's path and in his throes the Pope halted at the threshold of death.'"


