Marriage

To start your wedding planning, contact the parish office at 610-644-1655 at least six months prior to your wedding date for church availability and to schedule an initial meeting with a priest or deacon.

Baptism

At St. Norbert Parish, we celebrate baptisms on the 3rd weekend of each month during Mass. The Mass with Baptism rotates monthly among the 5:00 pm Saturday Vigil, and 9:00 am and 11:30 am Sunday morning Masses.

The Baptismal Registration and Godparent Eligibility forms can be found on the *Baptism* page of the parish website, under the *Sacraments* tab. Parents must attend a Baptism Prep class for the first child being baptized Catholic. Contact the parish office at 610-644-1655 to inquire about the Baptism process and upcoming dates/times of the monthly Masses.

Sponsor Certificates

If a registered member of St. Norbert Parish is in need of a Letter of Eligibility to be a Godparent for Baptism or Confirmation Sponsor, the individual...

- Must be at least 16 years old.
- Must have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation).
- If married, must have been married in the Catholic Church or a Convalidation Ceremony.
- Must be an active member of St. Norbert Parish.

Contact the parish office to request a Letter of Eligibility at least three weeks before the date needed and to arrange to pick up the letter.

Communion Visits

The Eucharist is nourishment in our time of need. Contact the parish office at 610-644-1655 to arrange for a sick or homebound parishioner to receive Holy Communion.

Anointing of the Sick

Opportunities for the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick are available regularly. Contact the parish office at 610-644-1655 for details to arrange for this sacrament. If the parish office is closed, and there is a danger of death, please follow the directions on the telephone messaging system regarding emergencies for parishioners. A priest will automatically be paged.

Friends,

We continue in Matthew's Gospel with another parable. Jesus explains it this way: "He who sows good seed is the Son of Man, the field is the world, the good seed the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the children of the evil one, and the enemy who sows them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the harvesters are angels."

One common tactic of the evil one is to subtly mix lies with the truth. The devil knows that if he were to propose a blatant lie, many would reject it outright. Instead, he attempts to create division and confusion by slowly suggesting his errors so that they are more readily believed. Therefore, "the children of the evil one" can be understood as those in this world who are under the devil's influence, as well as the legions of demons who attempt to sow confusion in our lives and within the Church.

One helpful way to prayerfully ponder this parable is to see yourself as one of those servants entrusted with guarding the field. Since the field is the world, we all have a duty to keep the lies of the evil one from flourishing. To do that, we must confront the most severe errors we encounter. For example, the dignity of the unborn child must be protected.

We must also work to protect the Church, our communities, and families from not only the grave errors of our times but also the most subtle ones. For example, within the Church, conflicts and confusions often arise. These divisions are part of the subtle lies sown by the evil one. Let's see that our souls are kept fertile so God's planted Word will take root and grow strong. It's essential to regularly guard our souls against the lies of the devil by relying upon our Church's authentic teachings and the saints' teachings. Be vigilant, constantly on the lookout for the seed of error sown within our world, the Church, and our own soul. Guard against the evil one who is always on the prowl.

Amigos,

Continuamos en el Evangelio de Mateo con otra parábola. Jesús la explica de esta manera: "El que siembra buena semilla es el Hijo del hombre, el campo es el mundo, la buena semilla los hijos del reino. Las malas hierbas son los hijos del maligno, y el enemigo que la siembra es el diablo. La cosecha es el fin del mundo, y los recolectores son los ángeles".

Una táctica común del maligno es mezclar sutilmente la mentira con la verdad. El diablo sabe que, si propusiera una mentira descarada, muchos la rechazarían de plano. En su lugar, intenta crear división y confusión sugiriendo lentamente sus errores para que sean creídos más fácilmente. Por tanto, "los hijos del maligno" pueden entenderse como aquellos que en este mundo están bajo la influencia del diablo, así como las legiones de demonios que intentan sembrar la confusión en nuestras vidas y dentro de la Iglesia.

Una forma útil de reflexionar en oración sobre esta parábola es verse a uno mismo como uno de esos siervos encargados de guardar el campo. Puesto que el campo es el mundo, todos tenemos el deber de impedir que prosperen las mentiras del maligno. Para ello, debemos enfrentarnos a los errores más graves que encontremos. Por ejemplo, hay que proteger la dignidad de los niños no nacidos.

También debemos trabajar para proteger a la Iglesia, nuestras comunidades y familias, no sólo de los graves errores de nuestro tiempo, sino también de los más sutiles. Por ejemplo, dentro de la Iglesia surgen a menudo conflictos y confusiones. Estas divisiones forman parte de las mentiras sutiles sembradas por el maligno.

Procuremos que nuestras almas se mantengan fértiles para que la Palabra de Dios plantada eche raíces y crezca fuerte. Es esencial proteger regularmente nuestras almas contra las mentiras del diablo apoyándonos en las enseñanzas auténticas de nuestra Iglesia y en las enseñanzas de los santos. Permaneced vigilantes, en constante búsqueda de la semilla del error sembrada en nuestro mundo, en la Iglesia y en nuestra propia alma. Guardaos del maligno que siempre está al acecho.

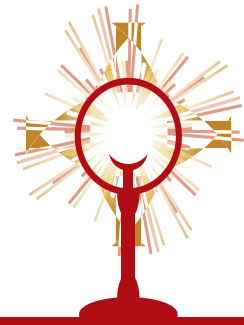

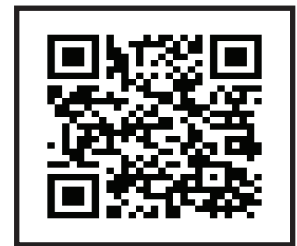

This is My Body Given Up for You

The Holy Mass – A Joyful Duty Part 2 of 4

Last week we began to consider the questions: “Is it *“just a rule”* or more?” We looked at the origins of the Lord’s Day. For the Israelite people, the Sabbath rest, the Lord’s Day, signified their imitating God and also His might act of liberation on their behalf from slavery to Pharaoh. Moses would receive the command to *“keep holy the Sabbath (the Lord’s Day)”* as one of the Ten Commandments of the Law. In Jesus, the Lord’s day would be perfected in the day of Resurrection; the memorial of Jesus’ conquering sin and death and opening the way to eternal life.

In the celebration of Holy Mass not only on Easter Sunday but every Sunday (even every day), Catholic Christians are renewed in the grace of their Baptism and are equipped to take those graces into the world, nourished by Jesus Christ’s own word and sacrifice, the Eucharist. As the fathers of the Second Vatican Council would emphasize anew the Eucharist in a certain sense makes the Church.

As a good Mother, the Church recognizes that her children sometimes need a nudge in order to pursue what is in their best interest. By the authority passed on to her from Jesus Christ, her spouse, the Church has power to put in place through her legitimate representatives (the Pope and Bishops in communion with him) certain binding precepts (commandments) for the good of the faithful. There are six to which we ordinarily refer. Of the six, one of particular importance is the precept to attend Holy Mass every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation. The exceptions to this include those who are sick or impeded from doing so by some grave obstacle.

In matters of grave concern to the faith and morals of the Christian faithful, the Church has an obligation to make laws which will help to preserve those souls on the pilgrimage to heaven that they might not be led astray. Sunday is the primordial feast day for the Christian. If we are going to live up to the name of Christian, we need to be not only with other Christians, but Christ, truly present among us.

During the Pandemic, authorities within the Church recognized, especially early on, that some might, out of love for God and neighbor my encounter undue burden in satisfying the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. In accord with this concern, for a time, the obligation was lifted and
